The programme of rambles has been organised to introduce people to the pleasure of walking in and around Redditch. Although a large and growing 'new town', Redditch is set in some beautiful Worcestershire countryside, and the town itself has several fine parks, woodlands, attractive lakes and meadowland; open for everyone to use and enjoy.

The rambles offer something for all people interested in the 'great outdoors' — for the experienced and inexperienced walker alike. There are rambles exploring footpaths and bridleways in the open countryside, nature trails around woodlands, marshes and meadowlands, plus guided tours around the historic Abbey Meadows.

A pair of strong shoes or walking boots are all that is needed to take part in any of the rambles. The map in this leaflet shows full details of the meeting places as well as other parks and woodlands in the town. In the case of bad weather or other unforeseen circumstances, the routes taken by the leaders may vary from that described. However, the starting points will always remain the same.

Redditch Borough Council employs six full time wardens who are actively involved in promoting the use of the countryside in and around Redditch. As well as working with local schools, the wardens run outdoor activity weeks, environmental workshops and a group of conservation volunteers. There are several groups and organisations in Redditch who also promote understanding and involvement in the countryside. RAMBLES ROUND REDDITCH 1990 PROGRAMME

FEBRUARY Sur

Sunday, February 4th

The 1990 programme starts with a ramble along the footpaths near Astwood Bank and Hunt End.

There will be a talk on the earthworks, plus visits to the excavated sites of the Gateway Chapel and Graveyard, the Abbey Church and the Industrial Site. The tour ends at the archaeological exhibition next to Forge Mill Museum and will include examining exhibits and artefacts found in recent excavations.

Meet at 2.00 p.m. at Forge Mill Museum car park in Needle Mill Lane. The 11/2 hour tour will be led by Barry Meade, Curator of the Museum.


